



# Process Flow Selection

 **PROCESS FLOW SELECTION**

Select cases where a specified activity is or isn't followed by another specified activity.

*e.g. only cases where "Invoice sent" is followed by "Invoice canceled"*

With the Process Flow Selection, you can select cases that are followed by a certain activity (or not).

In the selection fields, choose two activities. After that, you can select a connection operator:

- **Directly followed by:** Filter for cases that flow directly from the first to the second activity that you selected.
- **Indirectly followed by:** Filter for cases that flow from the first to the second activity. On their way, they might also pass other activities.
- **Not directly followed by:** Filter for cases that run through the first activity and are not directly followed by the second activity.
- **Not indirectly followed by:** Filter for cases that run through the first activity and are not directly or indirectly followed by the second activity.
